Liberty Career Academy is now a reality

The academy will hold an open house from 3-6 p.m. Aug. 2.

Students who prefer hands-on work rather than burying their heads in books will have a new diversion when school is back in session this year.

That's because the long-awaited Liberty College and Career Academy is on track to welcome students on the first day of school, CEO Tom Alexander said in July.

"Everything about this whole project keeps falling in place," Alexander said.

The academy is a public charter school under the supervision of the Liberty County School System in collaboration with Savannah Technical College, the Liberty County Chamber of Commerce and the Liberty County Development Authority.

Its mission is to provide students with technical and applied skills beyond the traditional academic curriculum, and it is one in a growing number of facilities statewide.

Lt. Gov. Casey Cagle championed the education shift to career readiness during a 2011 visit, touting that "not every child is going to college; that doesn't mean they aren't going to be successful."

And while part of the academy's purpose is to provide skills and certifications to those students who may not go on to academic institutions, local officials emphasize that students can enroll in the academy and maintain their collegiate tracks.

"We know now working with young people that most people don't go on and get a four-year degree, so we think it's important that high school kids leave us with more than just a diploma," Alexander said. "We also know that there is an outcry in the business sector that kids come to them being able to do more than

New cellphone policy eliminates suspension

Administrators: Confiscation is 'fair compromise'

When Liberty County students return to campus this fall, they will find a cellphone policy that gives them more leeway to have the devices, and the punishment for breaking the rule has turned from suspension to confiscation.

The Liberty County Board of Education approved the policy in May, and Title 1 Facilitator Harvey Grove anticipates it should be easy for students to follow.

While the old policy prohibited students from having cellphones on campus unless they were secured in their lockers, the new policy allows students to have their phones on campus as long as they are not in use between the hours of 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.

The policy in short

Students are allowed to have their phones on campus but may not use them between 7 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Violations no longer result in suspension; rather, confiscation during school hours is the consequence for students who are caught using their devices. The policy still prohibits students from operating electronic devices while on a school bus.

Under the old policy, if a teacher or administrator saw a cellphone, it would be confiscated and the student suspended. But the new policy allows the devices to be seen but not heard — or in use — during the prohibited hours.

Grove said the rule essentially requires that students turn off their cellphones as soon as they step foot on campus, but they will not be required to secure their phones in their lockers as the old policy mandated.

The consequence for using a phone during the prohibited hours now is confiscation. At all grades, the first offense receives seven days of school-day confiscation; the second offense receives 10 days of school-day confiscation, and the third and subsequent receives 14 school days of confiscation.

The new policy primarily was implemented to decrease the number of absences as a result of cell-

Welcome back! School will begin in just a week, and the Liberty County School System is here to meet your educational needs from prekindergarten to high school in a safe, secure environment. For information, registration, dress code and the code of conduct, call 876-3993.

Liberty County offers a Georgia Lottery-funded pre-K program for 4-year-olds to give them a jump start on kindergarten. This program is provided for free on a first-come, first-served basis for approximately 425 students who are 4 years old by Sept. 1. In grades K-12, Liberty County schools offer a standards-based curriculum based on the Common Core initiative. The curriculum is enhanced with the use of technology and designed to meet the needs of each student. Students are provided tutoring after school and on Saturdays to ensure that everyone has ample opportunity to master the curriculum. A differentiated curriculum is provided for all students, including those with disabilities and gifted students. The high school program offers advanced placement/honors courses, dual enrollment with local colleges and technical schools and work-based learning opportunities for students to gain work experience.

All of our schools offer a full range of extracurricular activities, including music, art, physical education, drama, sports, clubs and academic competitions.

This year will bring some exciting changes to our system. First, the Liberty College and Career Academy will open on Airport Road to provide exciting technical training for new career opportunities to our students. It also will provide for dual-enrollment opportunities with Savannah Technical College so that students may earn college credits, technical certification and diplomas while still enrolled in high school.

The renovations of Bradwell Institute are nearing completion, providing new and improved learning spaces for teaching and learning. Olvey Field will sport a complete makeover of the entire stadium for Bradwell sporting events. Come join the Tigers' football team at their home opener Aug. 31.

Suited to learn: Liberty dress code policies

The Liberty County School System dress code has some minor tweaks this year.

Elementary school students can wear navy or khaki pants, skirts, shorts, skorts and jumpers as long as they are not shorter than 3 inches above the kneecap.

Denim, knit, jogging, cargo, skinny and skater pants are not allowed. Pants and shorts legs cannot have zippers or pockets, and pockets cannot have zippers on them.

For elementary students, pants must be worn at the natural waist with a plain unadorned belt if belt loops are present.

Shirts that are solid white, navy or the elementary school's additional color are acceptable as long as they are tucked in and there are no ruffles, lace, elastic or smocking on them. Shirts may have school insignia, but no other ornamentation is allowed.

Middle school students can wear khaki, navy or black pants, shorts or skirts. Jumpers also are permitted as long as they are sleeveless and khaki with an approved shirt underneath.

High school students can wear khaki shorts or pants with one additional color chosen by each school. Liberty County High School students also can wear black pants, and Bradwell Institute students can wear navy pants or shorts.

Middle school and high school students are permitted to wear plain belts that are navy, black, brown, white or khaki.

They may wear solid white polo or collared shirts and blouses and the additional color chosen by their school that follows the same guidelines as the elementary schools.

Shoes must be enclosed and tied or fastened properly. Socks, tights, hose and leggings are allowed under uniforms and must be solid navy, black, white or the school color and must be a matched pair with no designs. Leggings and material containing spandex (Lycra) are not

School lunch program offers variety of healthy options

As Liberty County students return to school this fall, they'll find healthy new choices in their cafeterias.

Liberty County schools will serve meals that meet new federal nutrition standards. The standards ensure that meals are healthy, well-balanced and provide students all the nutrition they need to succeed at school, according to Liberty County School System Nutrition Director Dr. Chris Reddick.

"We're always working to offer Liberty County students healthier and tastier choices," Reddick said. "In addition to meeting new nutrition standards, we're also continuing our Fresh Fruits and Veg-

- milk, fruits, vegetables, proteins and grains, and they must meet strict limits for saturated fat and portion size.

The new standards include the following:

- age-appropriate calorie limits
- larger servings of vegetables and fruits (students must take at least one serving of produce)
- wider variety of vegetables, including dark green and red/orange vegetables and legumes
- fat-free or 1% milk (flavored milk must be fat-free)
- more whole grains
- less sodium

Full-price meals up 10 cents

An increase of 10 cents for full-price lunch was the only change from last year's policy. Reduced-price breakfast for elementary, middle and high school is 30 cents and lunch is 40 cents. Full-price breakfast for elementary school is \$1 and \$1.25 for middle and high school. Full-price lunch for elementary school is \$1.65 and \$1.90 for middle and high school.

The Liberty County School System made some changes to its policy for free and reduced-price meals for children under the national school lunch and breakfast program for the 2012-13 school year.

Family Free and Reduced Price Meal applications are available at www.liberty.k12.ga.us and in hard copy version at the schools. Every family must complete a new 2012-13 application to continue receiving any prior or new meal-price benefits.

The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year when family income or size changes.

To apply for free or reduced-price meals, households should fill out one application per family and return it to the school nutrition clerk in the school cafeteria or take it to the board of education building at 200 Bradwell St. in Hinesville. Families with foster children may include the foster children and other children in the household on one application.

Common Core standards stress application

"New" may be a buzzword this year as the Liberty County School System completes construction and embraces new technology, but the biggest change is in curriculum.

Liberty County schools will begin to implement the Common Core State Standards Initiative this year. As such, it will serve as a transition year, according to system curriculum Director Sandy Jones.

Common Core is a national initiative designed to ensure that the same standards are taught in every state, Jones said. Although multi-state, the program is not a federal mandate and there are no federal funds involved.

"The Common Core initiative was launched to provide coherence and consistency between states regarding what students should know and be able to do in order to be col-

lege and career ready and globally competitive," Jones said.

With Common Core comes "project-based, student-centered, technology-driven learning that will focus more on the application of knowledge rather than just memorization," Jones said. Because Common Core will make the requirements more transparent for students to be college and career ready, college remedial classes should become a thing of the past.

To be college and career ready means that each student will have the reading, writing, speaking, listening and language-development skills needed to succeed after high school, Jones said.

Since the Georgia Board of Education adopted Common Core on June 8, 2010, teachers have been introduced to the intricacies of the initiative through webinars and professional learning sessions.

In Liberty County, Common

Core initially will be implemented at all grade levels in math and English language arts classes. It will be rolled out soon afterward in science and social studies, with the goal of every subject's curriculum being designed according to Common Core standards, Superintendent Dr. Judy Scherer said.

The standards are a higher order of learning that focus more on synthesis and open-ended responses than on repetition and memorization, Scherer said. For example, students may be asked to read a graph and write a paragraph about what it means, read and analyze an article, read a story and find the multiplication in it, or learn what it means to be a "green" product.

With Common Core, students essentially will "be singing from the same song book," Scherer said.

This is especially important to the Liberty County School System because a large number of its student

body is military and moves quite frequently, Jones said. "Their playing field will be more level because the skills they learned in Georgia will be the same as in other states."

Common Core was spearheaded by the National Governors Association, the Council of Chief State School Officers, ACHIEVE, the College Board and the National Association of State Boards of Education.

Georgia officials involved in the program's inception include former Gov. Sonny Perdue, current state school board superintendent Dr. John D. Barge and former state school board superintendent Kathy Cox, Jones said.

In addition, "more than 60 large companies such as IBM and Dell have been at the table for much of the Common Core discussions and have endorsed the standards as well, which is very exciting for students, teachers and parents," Jones said.

Although Common Core is a

set of standards that every student should master, each state is able to add 15 percent of its own standards, such as Georgia history for Georgia, Jones said.

Many of the Common Core standards already were embedded into the Georgia Performance Standards, which were implemented in Georgia schools in 2004, Jones said.

However, Scherer said teachers and administrators have spent hours "deconstructing" the Common Core standards, identifying how students will master the concepts and aligning them with Georgia Performance Standards.

Administrative support for teachers in implementing Common Core is expected to continue throughout the year with collaborative sessions and on-site support, such as professional learning communities and classroom feedback, as needed.

Liberty Co. registration guidelines

Parents can register a new student for school at the school site in their attendance zone. Registration is open from 9 a.m.-11 a.m. Monday through Thursday.

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old and first-grade students must be 6 years old on or before Sept. 1, 2012. If your child did not attend kindergarten camp during the summer, contact the school to schedule a time to administer the screening test before the school year starts.

Sixth-grade students must provide proof of second MMR and second varicella vaccine.

For initial registration of students in all grades, the school system recommends you bring the following:

- Current Georgia Certificate of Immunization (Form 3231)
- Georgia Certificate of

Ear, Eye and Dental Screening (Form 3300)

- Social Security Card
- Acceptable evidence of date of birth: certified birth certificate; military ID; valid driver's license; passport; adoption record; religious record signed by an authorized religious official; official school transcript; or if none of the aforementioned evidences can be produced, an affidavit of age sworn by the parent or guardian accompanied by a certificate of age signed by a licensed practicing physician, which states that the physician has examined the child and believes that the age as stated in the affidavit is substantially correct.
- Two proofs of residence: The school will accept a current utility bill (water, gas, electric, local home phone, cable, etc.) AND any one of the following items: cur-

rent lease/rental agreement; most recent income tax return; current paycheck stub; current Medicaid card; current residential property tax statement or bill; current warranty or quick claim deed; current home purchase agreement; third-person affidavit of residency (while in the presence of a school official, a notarized statement shall be completed and signed by the parent or guardian as well as the legal owner or lessor of the property where the student and the parent, guardian or other person reside); current homeowner's insurance policy.

- Proof of enrollment and attendance (report card/school transcript) in an accredited school plus school address must be presented if registering during the 2012-13 school year.

Please note: Cases of pertussis (whooping cough) have increased in children, teens, and adults in the last few years. Tragically, some infants too young to be fully protected by vaccination have died. Ask your doctor or nurse if your children have received all the pertussis shots needed for his or her age. Also, if you haven't had your pertussis shot, you need to get one.

What is "Catch-up?" If your child's vaccinations are overdue or missing, get your child vaccinated as soon as possible. If your child has not completed a series of vaccinations on time, he or she will need only the remainder of the vaccinations in the series. There's no need to start over.

1. Your infant may not need a dose of HepB at age 4 months depending on the type of vaccine that your healthcare provider uses.
2. Your infant may not need a dose of Hib vaccine or RV vaccine at age 6 months depending on the type of vaccine that your healthcare provider uses.
3. One dose is recommended for most people. Children younger than age 9 years who are receiving influenza vaccine for the first time, or who received only 1 dose in the previous season (if it was their first vaccination season), should receive 2 doses spaced at least 4 weeks apart this season.
4. This dose of DTaP may be given as early as 12 months if it has been 6 months since the previous dose and you think you might not return for more shots by the time your child is age 18 months.

5. If your child's vaccinations are delayed or missed entirely, they should be given as soon as possible.
6. All girls and women age 11 through 26 years should be vaccinated with 3 doses of HPV vaccine, given over a 6-month period. (Girls as young as age 9 years may be vaccinated.)
7. If you have a teenager who is enrolling in college and planning to live in a dormitory and has not previously been vaccinated against meningococcal disease, they should be vaccinated now.

Classes at Liberty County schools will resume Aug. 6, and the last day of school is May 24.

The schedule has fewer four-day weeks than the last three years due to the school board's decision to reinstate former teacher furlough days. Each school will let out 15 minutes earlier than last year to accommodate the days being added back into the calendar. That means elementary schools will let out at 2:15 p.m. and middle schools and high schools at 3:10 p.m.

The schedule is slightly different from Bryan County schools, which begin Aug. 3 and end May 23. Long County schools begin

Aug. 10 and end May 24.

Chatham County schools, however, do not begin until Aug. 27 and run until June 7.

Local school officials made the calendar to accommodate as many pretesting lessons as possible while keeping holiday breaks intact.

Research has proven that if students don't refresh recently learned information over the summer, they tend to lose it completely. This often causes schools to spend two or three months reteaching lost knowledge. As a result, shorter summers may lead to a great retention of information.

phone suspensions, Grove said. The discipline record of the school system in the past three years suggested that many students were missing out on the learning process as a result of phone violations.

According to Mary Alexander, assistant superintendent of student services, phone violations accounted for 25 percent, or 742 out of the 2,954 suspensions, for the 2011-12 school year.

The new policy is a "realistic and reasonable" one, Grove said.

"The expectation is that students keep them turned off. Then, there are no worries about confiscation of their cellphones and suspension. If they know the punishment, then they can avoid the consequences by avoiding the offense," he added.

Administrators favor the policy, saying that they want students to be in school as much as possible to maximize learning. They also consider the new policy a "fair compromise" between giving students more freedom and reducing the number of suspensions.

"I grew up in a society where there weren't any cellphones," Grove said. "So, I know that we can function without them, even though it may not be as convenient for us."

If students are serious about being at school to learn, Grove said, they will be able

to handle the change without any problems.

Superintendent Dr. Judy Scherer seconded that notion.

"It's really about teaching students responsible use," Scherer said.

Because the new policy makes it less likely that teachers will need to interrupt lessons to handle cellphone violations, administrators hope the change will minimize class disruptions and put students in the mind to learn, Grove said.

The new cellphone policy came as a result of school representatives and parents getting together as a committee to push for the idea, Grove said.

However, some parents, like Marilyn Johns of Gum Branch, see the new policy as being too lenient. Johns, whose son will attend Bradwell Institute in the fall, believes that cellphones are not needed at all.

"If they can see them, they will be tempted to play with them," she said.

In response to the concern over the effect that phone usage limitations will have in cases of on-campus emergencies, Grove said there are phones available at schools for emergency reasons, and there are levels of communication among the administration that prevent the need of interference from students.

In fact, mass student use of cellphones in the case of an emergency could cause more disruption than help because lines can get jammed in cases of emergency, Grove added.

Paula Scott said she does not anticipate any transportation issues to the academy because students have been bused to Bradwell Institute for years to participate in technology and industry classes.

Alexander said district officials did a lot of promotion to ensure high enrollment in the school, and it seems to be a success.

At maximum capacity, the academy can serve around 700 students — though operations will begin with about 500 enrolled.

Program presentations were geared toward Panthers during school, the January open house, during three different registration nights and during an eighth-grade parent/student night, Scott said.

"The students were very interested in the programs being offered at the LCCA, and I believe we will see more and more of our students participating in these career pathways," Scott said. "Some of the most popular programs are culinary arts, graphic arts and nursing."

and they will be eligible to receive certifications through the Georgia Department of Labor's Georgia Best program.

Courses in 15 of the 22 pathways available in Liberty will be offered at the Airport Road campus for students in grades 10-12.

Academy students will spend half of their days at their home campus and half at the academy, and the school system will provide transportation. The academy also will have labs for virtual learning, so students who need course remediation can do so while still attending the academy.

Alexander said the transition may be a little tight for some students at lunch time, but officials have arranged class meeting times to accommodate the transport.

Three high school classes to get iPads

Teachers, administrators excited to see results

The Liberty County School System waves goodbye to pesky paper cuts with the launch of new digital course materials in both high schools this fall — at least for three classes.

Rather than replace the outdated textbooks previously used in some classrooms, district administrators opted to go the technological route with iPads and a digital curriculum.

"The teachers have been working hard all summer," said Patti Crane, the executive director of technology and media. "We're looking forward to hitting the ground running with it. The teachers are committed, and I think you'll find the students will benefit greatly from the time and contribution these teachers have made."

This year, three predominantly freshman classes — environmental science, world history and coordinate

algebra — try the switch to digital, but Superintendent Dr. Judy Scherer said she expects to see the program grow.

"I foresee us expanding it a few courses each year until all of our courses are done digitally, but it's going to take some time," Scherer said. "It does take time and money, but we are so pleased with what (the teachers) put together; I think we will continue to do that."

Over the summer, a team of teachers, a curriculum specialist and a technology specialist worked to develop an up-to-date curriculum, Crane said.

In May, Assistant Superintendent Jason Rogers said the district was looking to furnish 26 teachers with the technology, supplemental materials and applications to support 780 iPads at an estimated \$480,000.

Bradwell Institute environmental science teacher Sharyl Eastlake said she is excited to see the eighth-

graders who used the tablets in their science classes last year continue with the technology.

In January, the district introduced the devices in middle school science classes as part of Project Galaxy, funded through a \$1.35 million Department of Defense Education Activity grant. The next phase of the three-year grant will place the tablets in middle school math rooms this year.

"Oh, they're going to be excited," Eastlake said. "All eighth-graders that were in this county last year had iPads in their hands in their classes, and this will be a continuation into high school."

The biggest challenge presented by the change to digital course material was for the teachers, not for the students, Eastlake said.

"Going from a real, printed textbook to all digital resources is hard for older teachers because we've always had a textbook in front of us," Eastlake said. "We

like the feel of the pages, the smell of the books. It's more of a challenge for the adults than it is for the students because they were born in the digital age."

One distinct advantage of using a digital curriculum instead of print is the ability to tailor the material to an individual child's needs, Eastlake said.

"Differentiation is a big buzzword in education, and the teachers in our county have been learning about differentiation for a long time," Eastlake said. "This is a perfect way to differentiate because you can get articles about the environment in any reading level. You can tailor their education for them by finding articles and books that are maybe on a more appropriate reading level."

The team that worked so diligently on the course material this summer expects to see improved interest, participation and test scores, according to Scherer.

"We know that students are much more involved and much more motivated with digital content, so it was a matter of putting all the pieces together and saying, 'Let's try it,'" Scherer said. "Our science scores went up with the eighth-graders last year, and even though the test was given about three months after we started the iPads, we think that is the reason. We do know that technology motivates students to be more involved and more energized about learning."

This year will serve as a trial to see if performance improves with the addition

of the tablets in the three classes.

Jordan Crumling, a student entering ninth grade at Bradwell this year, was introduced to tablet-based instruction during the last school year when the Galaxy Project placed iPads in middle school science classes.

Although he complained that his teacher did not let students play games on their iPads and forced them to work on their schooling, Crumling said he preferred using the tablet to a textbook.

"It's way better to use an iPad, definitely," Crumling said. "They're much easier to get your work done because you don't have to go through the pages and if you lose something, you can just pull it right back up."

Tax holiday back, but after classes start

Georgia is holding its first back-to-school shopping sales tax holiday since 2009, but the occasion may be bittersweet for some.

The Aug. 10-11 holiday falls after Liberty County students return to school Aug. 6, which is not ideal for making tax-free school-supply purchases.

According to the Georgia Department of Revenue, tax-exempt items include clothing and footwear less than \$100 per item, general school supplies less than \$20 per item and personal computers and computer-related accessories less than \$1,000 per item.

Bradwell's renovations a wrap — almost

When the construction dust settles at Bradwell Institute this fall, it will be the first break from construction in years and the last students may see for a while.

"Since I've been at Bradwell, it's been under construction, so it's going to be nice having that out of the way," said Principal Scott Carrier, who is going on his third year at the school. "At least on a temporary basis, we won't have any construction going on."

The Liberty County Board of Education has yet to move forward with plans for the final phase of renovations, though administrators have indicated in meetings that the board previously earmarked about \$8 million for that purpose.

Deputy Superintendent Dr. Cheryl Conley said in mid-July that JE Dunn Construction Company had two construction crews working around the clock to complete the \$13.9 million phase 4, stage 2 work designed by

"For every day that they work, that's two days of work, and for every week that they work, that's two weeks of work ...," Conley told the BoE on July 10. "We're still on schedule."

Originally slated for completion July 31, the work includes renovations to the 100, 500 and 700 halls, relocation and renovation of the agriculture lab to the 300 hall and renovations and upgrades to the mechanical system and several labs.

The renovation also includes installation of a new chill-water air-conditioning system, which JE Dunn project manager Zack Johns said is the most time-intensive part of the work.

Johns said the project is on track to be completed on time, and Conley said administrators have a contingency plan for the Aug. 2 open house if the 500 and 700 hallways are not complete.

Returning students will notice some changes, but Carrier said students should not be confused by the new

appearance.

"The actual setup of the interior of the school will be the same; the hallways will be in the same position they were in before. ... From that perspective, kids aren't going to have any problem," he said. "The biggest change for the kids is going to be places where teachers have been for the past several years; they're not going to

be there anymore."

Classrooms mostly have been consolidated by subject areas, which Carrier said will make navigation easier for students down the road.

The 500 hallway that once housed business, culinary and interior design classes now will have science rooms. Science also is moving into the 700 hall-

Olvey Field to open, too

Bradwell students also will return to a renovated Olvey Field with the regular-season opener against Liberty County High School at 7:30 p.m. Aug. 31. Athletes and fans will see the results of the \$6.7 million phase 2 renovations — which include rotating and reconstructing the field, stands and concessions — and the \$1.9 million phase 1 work constructing a new field house and practice field.

Bradwell Principal Scott Carrier said he anticipates the local rivalry and community curiosity about the new field will boost attendance.

"I think the combination of those two things will give us a real good opening turnout, and we hope that the facility is very nice and people are very comfortable and that that will keep people coming back to support our student-athletes," he said.

way, where graphic arts, health occupations and agriculture used to be.

Because the footprints of some labs were changed, some class doors may be in new places, though they should be near their former locations.

As part of the work, the agriculture program will move across campus from the 300 hallway to the 700 hallway and will fill the space that used to be three classrooms.

Agriculture also has new

outdoor facilities, including a greenhouse, shade cloth and animal habitat.

"The agriculture program is a very popular program in our school, and a lot of kids like to take part in it, but our facility was very outdated," Carrier said. "Most of the CTAE classes got some type of renovation — most of them moving out to the career academy, of course. ... This is allowing it to stay just as modern as all of those facilities that have moved."

FPCA continues innovation tradition

Open house 4-6 p.m. Aug. 2; classes commence Aug. 6 and end May 24

First Presbyterian Christian Academy plans to grow its reputation as a school that offers an innovative learning experience with the addition of several new and innovative programs for the upcoming school year.

Principal Shannon Hickey said the school is continuing to "adapt to the needs of the community in a way that it always has in the past."

The school began as a mothers'-day-off program that offered a preschool alternative for stay-at-home mothers, Hickey said. Since then, FPCA has grown into a school with a student body of more

than 400, including its fifth senior class this year.

FPCA Head of School Sammi Hester said the school's enrollment has increased by 100 students since last school year.

New programs for the upcoming school year include a pre-Advanced Placement program for middle school students and a digital classroom.

The accelerated program for students in grades six through eight is a collaborative effort that involves preparing middle school students for the rigorous college-credit work.

Normal classes don't delve deeply into the critical thinking aspect of learning, but

Hickey said the courses will try to overcome that. In the pre-AP program, students will not simply learn that the Civil War happened; they will delve more deeply into the reasons why it occurred.

"It's something we've been working on for over a year, and to the best of our knowledge, there is nothing like it in the area," Hester said.

The coming year also will be the pilot year for a digital classroom to be tested on

fourth- and fifth-graders. If successful, the program will be implemented in other classrooms with the support of a technology fee.

The digital classroom was conceived as a way to determine whether a completely digital, virtually paperless classroom will raise test scores, aid in retention of knowledge and cause students to become more engaged in the learning process, Hester said.

Technology teacher Maria Reed has noticed that when a student enters the technology lab, he or she becomes a "totally different child — a child who is more passionate about learning."

The digital classroom will come with a "built-in learning-management system," Reed said, adding that the class will work virtually by collaborating through the learning-management system, or LMS. Students will be able to retrieve and submit their homework and collaborate with teachers and other students using the LMS.

Parents will be able to access their children's homework assignments more readily because of the system, Hester added.

The digital classroom also will include some high-tech equipment, including a docu-

ment camera, projectors, e-books, electronic tablets and laptops.

Also new this year are FPCA's football and wrestling programs, Hester said. The first football game is set for Aug. 31 at the Liberty County Recreation Department.

The school's priorities are character first, academics second and extracurricular activities third, Hickey said.

"We are family by choice," the principal added. "It's very unique, warm and inviting."

"Students have more of a sense of belonging than at public schools. ... At most private schools, you will find 'a bunch of rich white kids' to the exclusion of everybody else. You won't find that at FPCA. This school is very ethnically, socioeconomically and religiously diverse."

School Uniform Dress Code

In the interest of improved student performance, school safety, a reduction in student disruptions, and improved student self esteem, the Liberty County Board of Education has enacted a mandatory uniform dress code policy for all students in kindergarten through grade twelve. School administrators will be responsible for making final determinations as to whether a student's attire or appearance is in conflict with the written procedures.

Elementary Dress Code Procedures

The following clothing styles and colors will be considered appropriate:

1. Solid navy or khaki pants, skirts, jumpers with approved tops, skorts (skirts with shorts), and shorts are allowed. Shorts, skirts, jumpers, and skorts must not be more than three inches above the top of the knee cap.
2. Only solid white or navy polo shirts (no ruffles, lace, elastic, or smocking) will be allowed. Blouses and button down shirts are no longer allowed. One additional color has been chosen by each school

Uniforms must also abide by the following guidelines:

1. Shirts may have a school insignia, but no other ornamentation, including labels, are allowed on any clothing; (Buttons and tabs that are part of the garment when purchased are not considered ornamentation);
2. Shirts must be tucked;
3. No denim, knit pants, jogging or cargo pants, "skinny" pants, or skater pants;
4. Uniforms must be made of a standard uniform material such as cotton or twill;
5. No zippers or pockets or pant legs;
6. Shorts and pants cannot have pockets on the legs; and
7. Uniforms must be worn at the natural waist. They cannot be poorly fitted or oversized and baggy, so as to allow sagging of the pants. Belts must be worn if pants, skirts, or shorts have belt loops. If belts have buckles, they must not be oversized nor have any writing that is considered offensive.

Accessories

1. Shoes must be a matched pair and be enclosed and fastened/tied properly;
2. Solid color sweaters or sweatshirts without hoods and without an insignia (color appropriate to the school) may be worn over uniform shirts;
3. Coats and jackets must be worn open in the building;
4. White, gray, or black T-shirts, or a color appropriate to the school, may be worn under uniform shirts. Solid colored turtlenecks (white or a color appropriate to the school) may be worn under uniform shirts;
5. No manner of clothing, jewelry, button, or pin may display drugs, cigarettes, sexually suggestive items, alcohol, profanity, gang related logos or messages, or pictures or words that are determined

to be distracting or demeaning to others by the school's administrators;

6. Hats, caps, sweatbands, bandannas, sunglasses, and other head coverings inside the building are not permitted;
7. Pierced earrings are permissible when worn in the earlobes as designed. Other body piercing are not permitted to be visible at school. Students may not wear at school items such as nose rings, nose pins, tongue rings, tongue pins, or any jewelry to accessorize facial or body piercings;
8. Extreme color/hairstyles, make-up, etc. must not be a distraction, immodest, inflammatory, or offensive;
9. Chains, wallet chains, and spiked jewelry are not allowed on campus or at school related activities;
10. Only tights, hose, leggings, or socks may be worn under uniforms. Tights, hose, leggings, and socks must be solid navy, black, white, or the school color and must be a matched pair; No designs may be worn; and
11. Students enrolled in the STAR program or JROTC will be permitted to wear approved uniforms.

Dress Down Days

School administrators will be able to allow "Dress Down Days" occasionally as a motivator or reward. Dress on these days should follow the Liberty County Dress Policy for dress down days as listed in the Code of Conduct. "Dress Down Days" should not be held during the first nine weeks of the school year (with the exception of school picture day). School administrators will also have the authority to allow groups to modify their dress on given days to allow for special programs and/or situations. This could include cheerleaders, sports teams, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.

Liberty County Elementary Dress Code Requirements for Dress Down Days

1. Shoes must be worn at all times for health and safety reasons. The following are not permitted: shoes which damage the carpet or floors, bedroom shoes, flip flops, shoes with wheels, or shoes with heels over 1 1/2 inch in length;
2. Hats, caps, sweatbands, and sunglasses worn inside the building are not permitted except on specified days or particular situations as determined by the school's administrators;
3. Halter tops, midriffs, muscle shirts, net shirts, cutaways, pajamas, lounging pants, clothing with words across the seat, or any garment that shows the stomach or waistline in the back are not permitted;
4. Sleeveless tops must have a strap of at least two (2) inches in width across the shoulders. Revealing necklines are not permitted;
5. Spandex clothing and sheer garments worn as the primary garments are not permitted;
6. Pants must be worn at the natural waist. They cannot be poorly fitted or oversized and baggy, so as to allow sagging of the pants. Belts must be worn if pants, skirts, or shorts have belt loops. Belt buckles must not be oversized nor have any writing that is considered offensive;
7. Clothing with suggestive words or pictures are not permitted;
8. Overall must be fastened;
9. Bicycle shorts are not permitted;
10. Shorts and skirts must not be more than three inches above the top of the kneecap.

11. Shorts must be worn under skirts when the child is participating in rigorous physical activity;
12. Clothing that is torn, ripped, or unhemmed either by accident or style is not permitted;
13. Extreme color/hairstyles, make-up, etc., must not be a distraction, immodest, inflammatory, or offensive;
14. Pierced earrings are permissible when worn in the earlobes as designed. Tattoos and other body piercings are not permitted to be visible at school. Students may not wear at school items such as nose rings, nose pins, tongue rings, tongue pins, or any jewelry to accessorize facial or body piercings; and,
15. No manner of clothing, jewelry, button, or pin may display drugs, cigarettes, sexually suggestive items, alcohol, profanity, gang related logos or messages, or pictures or words that are determined to be distracting or demeaning to others by the school's administrators.

School Dress Code Closets

Each school will maintain a uniform dress closet. This closet will contain a variety of sizes of uniforms for students who are newly enrolled or are noncompliant.

Newly Enrolled Students

Students newly enrolled in the school system will be given ten (10) school days to adequately prepare for the dress code policy. Until that time they may borrow uniforms from the Uniform Dress Closet without penalty. However, students must wear a school uniform each day.

Noncompliance Procedures

Each school will strive to achieve full compliance within the guidelines of the Uniformed Dress Code Policy. Since non compliance interferes with the smooth operation of the school, the plan listed below has been developed to address students who do not comply with the required dress code procedures. If a student comes to school out of uniform, the following measures will be taken. A uniform will be provided to the student which will be returned at the end of the day as well as:

1st Occurrence ~ The teacher will send home a letter from the administrator.

2nd Occurrence ~ The teacher will send home a letter from the administrator and call the parent or guardian.

3rd Occurrence ~ A conference will be set up between an administrator and the parent to address the problem and develop a solution.

4th Occurrence ~ School officials will administer punishments as set up under Level I in the Code of Conduct.

5th & Additional Occurrences ~ School officials will administer punishments as set up under Levels I or II in the Code of Conduct.

Middle/High School Dress Code Procedures

The following clothing styles and colors will be considered appropriate:

1. Solid khaki pants and skirts no shorter than 3 inches above the knee. Shorts and pants cannot have pockets or zippers on the legs. Each school is allowed one additional color choice of pants, skirts, or shorts. Liberty County High School may also wear black, and Bradwell Institute may also wear navy blue. Lewis Frasier Middle School, Midway Middle School, and Snelson Golden Middle School may also wear navy or black.
2. Jumpers (sleeveless and of khaki color) worn with a shirt or blouse already specified in the dress code will be acceptable.

3. Solid white polo or collared shirts and blouses will be allowed. One additional color has been chosen by each middle or high school.

Red: Lewis Frasier Middle
Please contact the school for the exact shade of each color.

Uniforms must also abide by the following guidelines:

2. Shirts must be tucked in and with no cleavage visible.
2. Shirts must be tucked in and with no cleavage visible.
3. No denim, jogging, "skinny" pants, skater pants, or cargo pants, leggings, or material containing spandex (Lycra)
4. Uniforms must be made of a standard uniform material such as cotton or twill; and have a sewn hem.
5. No zippers or pockets on pant legs; and,
6. Uniforms must be worn at the natural waist. They cannot be poorly fitted, tight, body hugging, or oversized and baggy, so as to allow sagging of the pants. Belts must be worn if pants or skirts have belt loops. Belts must be solid and unadorned navy, black, brown, white, or khaki. Belts and belt buckles must not be oversized nor have any writing or symbols.

Accessories

1. Shoes must be a matched pair and must be enclosed at the front and fastened/tied properly. Shoes must be a matched pair. Shoes with wheels are not allowed. Bedroom shoes and slippers are not allowed.
2. Solid color sweaters or sweatshirts without hoods and without an insignia (color appropriate to the school) may be worn over uniform shirts;
3. Coats and jackets must be left in the student's locker during the school day;
4. White, gray, or black T-shirts, or a color appropriate to the school, may be worn under uniform shirts. Solid color turtlenecks (white or a color appropriate to the school) may be worn over uniform shirts;
5. No manner of clothing, jewelry, button, or pin may display drugs, cigarettes, sexually suggestive items, alcohol, profanity, gang related logos or messages, or pictures or words that are determined to be distracting or demeaning to others by the school's administrators;
6. Hats, caps, sweatbands, sunglasses, and other head coverings inside the building are not permitted. These items are only allowed outside the building and must not obscure the person's identity. Bandannas are not allowed on school property.
7. Pierced earrings are permissible when worn in the ear as designed. Other body piercings are not permitted to be visible at school. Students may not wear at school items such as nose rings, nose pins, tongue rings, tongue pins, or any jewelry to accessorize facial or body piercings;
8. Extreme hair color/hairstyles, make-up, etc., must not be a distraction, inflammatory, or offensive. Facial hair must be neatly trimmed;
9. Chains, wallet chains, and spiked jewelry are not allowed on campus or at school related activities;
10. Only tights, hose, leggings, or socks may be worn. Tights, leggings, and socks must be solid black, tan, navy, white, or the

school color and must be a matched pair. No hose with designs may be worn; and

11. Students enrolled in the STAR program or JROTC will be permitted to wear approved program uniforms.

Dress Down Days

School administrators will be able to allow "Dress Down Days" occasionally as a motivator or reward. Dress on these days should follow the Liberty County Dress Policy for dress down days as listed in the Code of Conduct. "Dress Down Days" should not be held during the first month of a school year (with the exception of school picture day). School administrators will also have the authority to allow groups to modify their dress on given days to allow for special programs and/or situations. This could include cheerleaders, sports teams, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, etc.

All teachers will enforce the above items on a daily basis each period. Should a student not be in compliance with the dress code, he/she will be required to comply before returning to class. All students must comply with the above dress code for the entire school day including during physical activity time, during PE, JROTC, etc. This includes cheerleaders/dance team, flag corps, and other groups except during performances.

Violation of the dress code will result in a Level I or Level II Discipline depending upon the severity and frequency of the offense.

Middle School and High School Dress Code Requirements for Dress Down Days

1. Shoes must be worn at all times, tied securely, and firmly anchored to the feet. No shower shoes, bedroom shoes, shoes with wheels, slippers, or roller blades are allowed;
2. Shirts must be long enough to be tucked in even if they are not tucked in (no bare midriffs);
3. No manner of clothing, jewelry, button, or pin may display drugs, cigarettes, sexually suggestive items, alcohol, profanity, gang related logos or messages, or pictures or words that are determined to be distracting or demeaning to others by the school's administrators;
4. All shirts/dresses/tops must be fitted around the arm so that undergarments are not exposed. The width of the strap over the shoulder must be at least two (2) inches. No low-cut, revealing shirts are allowed;
5. Hats, caps, sweatbands, bandannas, sunglasses, and other head coverings inside the building are not permitted;
6. Spandex clothing is not permitted;
7. Shirts and pants must be free of deliberate holes and tears;
8. Shorts, skirts, and jumpers must be non-body hugging, have a sewn hem,

and must not be more than three inches above the top of the kneecap. Splits in skirts must follow the same rule;

9. Facial hair must be neatly trimmed;
10. Pants must be worn at the natural waist. They cannot be poorly fitted or oversized and baggy, so as to allow sagging of the pants. Belts must be worn if pants, skirts, or shorts have belt loops. Belt buckles must not be oversized nor have any writing that is considered offensive;
11. Sheer garments are not permitted;
12. If pants, shorts, or skirts have straps which fit over the shoulders, the straps must be fastened in front and back of clothing and must be worn on the shoulders;
13. Pierced earrings are permissible when worn in the earlobes as designed. Tattoos and other body piercings are not permitted to be visible at school. Students may not wear at school items such as nose rings, nose pins, tongue rings, tongue pins, or any jewelry to accessorize facial or body piercings;
14. Extreme color/hairstyles, make-up, etc., must not be a distraction, immodest, inflammatory, or offensive; and,
15. Chains, wallet chains, and spiked jewelry are not allowed on campus or at school related activities.

Middle and High School: School Dress Code Closets

Each school will maintain a uniform dress closet. This closet will contain a variety of sizes of uniforms for students who are newly enrolled or are noncompliant.

Middle and High School: Newly Enrolled Students

Students newly enrolled in the school system will be given ten (10) school days to prepare adequately for the dress code policy. Until that time they may borrow uniforms from the Uniform Dress Closet without penalty. However, students must wear a school uniform each day.

Middle and High School: Non-compliance Procedures

Each school will strive to achieve full compliance within the guidelines of the Uniform Dress Code Policy. Since non-compliance interferes with the smooth operation of the school, the plan listed below has been developed to address students who do not comply with the required dress code procedures. If a student is not in compliance with the dress code, the following measures will be taken.

1st Occurrence ~ Referral for after school office detention AND either ISS or fix problem;

2nd Occurrence ~ Referral for one day Saturday school AND either ISS or fix problem;

3rd Occurrence ~ Assignment to ISS for three additional days AND either ISS or fix problem;

4th & Additional Occurrences ~ 1 day of OSS for each occurrence AND either ISS or fix problem.

The Liberty County School System prohibits the possession of electronic devices, including cellular phones, during the school day.

All students shall be prohibited from using any electronic devices during the operation of a school bus, including but not limited to, cellular phones, pagers, audible radios, tape or compact disc players, or any other electronic device that might interfere with the school bus communication equipment or the school bus driver's operation of the school bus.

Liberty County Schools/District will not be responsible for investigating or replacing/reimbursing lost or stolen communication devices.
